LISTENING TO GOD

Familiarity, in the case of the Lord's Prayer, probably hasn't bred contempt in most of us, but it certainly can breed a kind of inertia. The words we speak in prayer run the same risks as all our other human words: they can be spoken hastily, thoughtlessly, carelessly. In a manner parallel to the words we say in the Lord's Prayer—"forgive us as we forgive others"—today might be the day to invite God to "listen to us as well as we listen to you." Today might be the day to listen to the Lord's Prayer with newly attentive ears.

Let us learn from the example of Luke's Jesus, who would not instruct others how to pray until he himself had been a man of prayer. Moreover, listen carefully to the follow-up Jesus gives for the prayer itself. In our quick-fix society we must heed the call to persistence; in a world that puts glib explanations on difficult situations we must continue to seek and knock; in our all-too-humanness, we must be open to the patience, grace, and wisdom of the will of God. SAINT MARTHA (first century)

July 29

Whether you find Martha Stewart admirable or annoying, she has the perfect patron saint. Luke describes Martha—saint, not Stewart—as

"burdened with much serving" (Luke 10:40). About Mary, seated, listening to Jesus, Martha complained, "Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?" Jesus' response, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things . . . Mary has chosen the better part" (10:41, 42), suggests to some the superiority of the contemplative life, leaving the rest of us, supporting families, earning livings, (helping others?), as "second-class" Christians. But Luke introduces Martha and Mary immediately after Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan, whom Jesus recommends as a model of practical compassion, concluding, "Go and do likewise" (10:37). Go and do! Sit and listen! Discipleship is never either/or but both/and. Jesus ministered in prayerful silence *and* hospitable service. Monastic calendars add Martha's sister Mary and brother Lazarus, calling all three "hosts of the Lord," recalling their welcome of Jesus to their home in Bethany, reminding us Whom we welcome whenever we extend summertime hospitality!

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is good to be back home! The trip to Belgium went well. My flight from Eau Claire to Chicago was cancelled at the last minute, leaving me to get over to Minneapolis for a connecting flight. I made it in time and that was the only glitch. I arrived in Brussels the following morning and was met by Fr. Paul Czerwonka who happens to be teaching at American College in Louvain (Louvain), Belgium, about 20 minutes away. I stayed with him that night and did a bit of sightseeing before catching the train to Gent. I knew Bishop Fulton Sheen went to the seminary in Louvain, but I forgot that our own Fr. Goldsmith did as well. In fact, he had to be one of the first graduates. One of the office workers made a photocopy of the handwritten page recording his ordination dates (in Latin). At the end of the record was a handwritten note in English which read: "Very dear Father worked to his last hour in writing his newspaper, and in praying his office and his rosary. His death was very easy and most edifying. Died 27 Nov. 1890, Chippewa Falls." What a wonderful memory to have. Our new Bishop, William Callaghan, will be installed on Wednesday, August 11th as the Tenth Bishop of LaCrosse. Previous to this date I will be offering a special Mass of Thanksgiving in each parish. Continue to pray for him and our diocese.

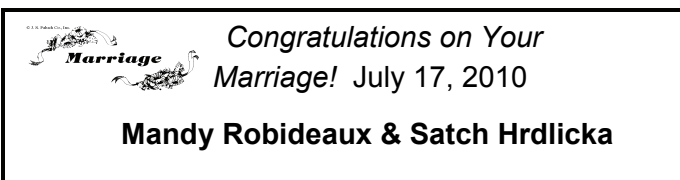

The Very Rt. Rev. Goldsmith along with Fr. Abbelin took charge of St. Peter's when Fr. Koke, the first resident pastor of St. Peter's, was summoned away to do other missionary work in 1870. The Goldsmith Chapel by Notre Dame Church is named after him. Fr. Baches arrived in May 1871 and was pastor until 1873.

During this time, the following took place:

The school had to be closed in 1870, due to a measles epidemic.

St. Peters had 321 adult members or communicants.

St. Catherine's (Brush Prairie NE of Bloomer) was the first missionary church under St. Peters.

40 hour devotions was held for the first time at St. Peters.

Fr. Koke's salary was \$500.00.

Franz Stoffel, resident teacher, received \$30.00 a month.
