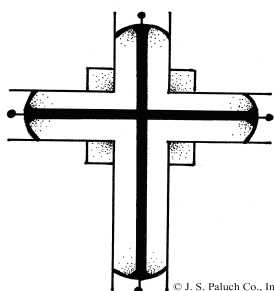

### SPEAK, LORD, WE ARE LISTENING

In today's first reading God keeps calling out in the night to a sleeping boy. Neither the boy, Samuel, nor his teacher, Eli, understands who is calling. But God's persistence convinces them. Samuel is then ready--not ready yet to do anything, but ready to listen. "Speak, for your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10).

In the Gospel Jesus is out teaching. Various people notice him and begin to gather around. They soon become disciples and, like the young Samuel, are ready--not ready yet to do anything, but ready to listen. "Speak," they say, "we are listening."

God's voice is always with us, awake or asleep. It swirls around us like fog on a waterfront, enveloping us, gently urging us to wake up, to listen. Awareness of the voice comes first; then willingness to listen; then, in time, the decision to act, to live according to God's word. ### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every year, close to the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on January 25, and before the feast of the Chair of St. Peter on February 22, the cause of Church unity is commended to Christians everywhere. Sadly, Protestants, Orthodox, and Catholics have settled to a status quo of separation. When baptized people become Catholic, we speak of them as being received into "full communion." That means we already share a communion in faith in many ways, including the Word of God. Many Protestant denominations have received and revised the three-year cycle of readings first arranged by Catholics in the early 1970s. Therefore, many of your neighbors who are not Catholic are celebrating and reflecting on the same readings we are savoring on most Sundays of the year. This makes for a new spirit of cooperation among preachers of the gospel, and gives hope that the cause of reunion, desired by Christ, has great vitality at the table of God's Word, and will one day lead to unity at the table of the Lord's Body and Blood. --James Field

WEEK of PRAYER



for CHRISTIAN UNITY

Dear Parishioners,

In his post-synodal apostolic exhortation, *Verbum Domini* (The Word of the Lord), Pope Benedict makes mention of a particular suggestion of the synod Fathers "that churches give a place of honor to the Sacred Scriptures, *even outside of liturgical celebrations.*" The Holy Father confirms this recommendation saying, "It is good that the book which contains the word of God should enjoy a visible place of honor inside the Christian temple...."

The Book of the Gospels has always been given special reverence because it contains the written record of the words and deeds of Jesus, the Word of God made flesh. Beginning at Christmas, St. Charles has begun "enthroning" the Book of the Gospels following its proclamation at Mass. Placed between the altar and tabernacle, the Gospel Book becomes a visible reminder of "*the double table of the word and of the Eucharist.*" (*Verbum Domini*)

It is not insignificant that the Book of the Gospels is laid upon the altar at the beginning of Mass, from there carried to the ambo where it is proclaimed to the faithful, and then reverently carried to "a visible place of honor." So too, bread and wine, the elements of the Eucharist are placed upon the altar, having been transformed into Christ's Body and Blood they are given to the faithful, and finally the Eucharist is reposed in the tabernacle. Pope Benedict offers the following quotation from St. Jerome which is pertinent to our reflection:

"For me the Gospel is the Body of Christ... When we approach the [Eucharistic] Mystery, if a crumb falls to the ground we are troubled. Yet when we are listening to the Word of God, and God's Word and Christ's flesh and blood are being poured into our ears yet we pay no heed, what great peril should we not feel?"

For St. Jerome and for Pope Benedict, it is clear that the Mass is truly a "*double feast.*" We are fed by God's Word as he comes to us in the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures. And, we are fed by the Word made flesh as he comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine. Certainly, the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is wholly unique - a substantial presence. Yet Christ is certainly also present in the proclamation of the word of God. Thus, the care and reverence we show to the Eucharist should reflect the care and reverence we have for the Sacred Scriptures. As St. Jerome tells us, this begins with attentive and prayerful listening. But, as the Holy Father suggests, it also extends to the care extended to the book containing the word of God.

Many heart-felt thanks to Jim Loew, who fabricated the Gospel Book stand, and Milford Lechleitner and Mark Abramowicz for their assistance! The stand beautifully matches the tabernacle stand on a smaller scale and is a very fitting resting place for God's holy word.

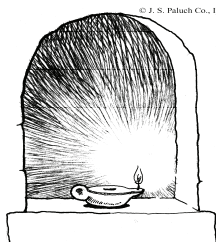
