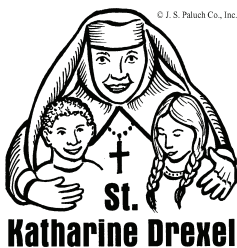
Second Sunday of Lent February 28, 2010

ALL ABOUT CHANGE

On this Second Sunday of Lent the scriptures remind us that when we have an encounter with our God, things are bound to change. In the first reading God tells Abram to raise his eyes to the sky, promising descendants as numerous as the stars. Abram's act of faith in the Lord is sealed in covenant, forever changing the course of salvation history. In the Gospel story of the Transfiguration, always proclaimed on this Lenten Sunday, the Lord Jesus changes in appearance before the eyes of the apostles who, like Abram, raise their eyes to the spectacle in the sky. It is Saint Paul who brings it all together for us: "He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (Philippians 3:21). Lent is all about change, all about conversion. Let us cast our own eyes to heaven, awaiting that day when we will be changed--when we will share in Christ's glory.

**SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL
(1858-1955)
March 3**

Born into Philadelphia society, Katharine was an infant when she lost her mother. Her father remarried and the couple taught their daughters that their wealth was a "gift on loan" to be shared with the poor, whom they fed and cared for in their home. Invited by priest-friends to witness firsthand the destitution on Native American reservations, Katharine resolved to devote her inheritance to this apostolate and enter a contemplative order. When, however, in private audience, she begged Leo XIII to send missionaries to staff the schools she was building, the pope replied, "My child, why not become a missionary yourself?" Katharine renounced a twenty-million-dollar fortune and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, adoring Christ present in the Eucharist and ministering to Christ suffering in victims of racial discrimination. Her Sisters established over sixty schools nationwide, including Xavier University, New Orleans, the first dedicated to professional education for African Americans. In 2000, John Paul II canonized "Mother Drexel," praising her "excellent example of practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, long the distinguishing mark of American Catholics." —Peter Scagnelli, ©

From the Pastor's Desk

Second Sunday of Lent

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent is one of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary – the Transfiguration. Peter, James, and John ascend Mount Tabor with Jesus. Before their very eyes Jesus is transfigured in light and appears conversing with Moses and Elijah. The "Tabor Experience" at the Transfiguration is often used in Christian spirituality to describe what is called "contemplative prayer." Contemplative prayer is not so much a technique of prayer such as meditation. Christian contemplative prayer is more a level of intimacy with God in prayer. As the apostles entered more and more into a trusting, loving relationship with Jesus, more and more about Jesus was revealed to them. This should be a somewhat "natural" experience for the Christian who regularly meditates on the sacred mysteries of faith (scripture and doctrine), who receives the sacraments on a regular basis, and who quiets his or her soul to listen to the Lord. Gradually the Lord opens himself up to the individual soul who seeks him. Love encounters love in a supernatural way. One of the best ways to open your heart and soul to this kind of encounter with Christ is in the solitude and silence of Eucharistic adoration. We are so fortunate to have the Goldsmith Chapel at Notre Dame where one can go anytime of the day or night to be with the Lord. Go spend some time with him this Lent. You may not want to leave either!

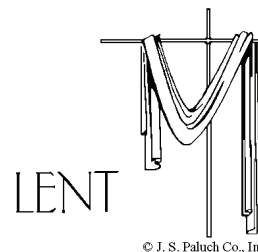
