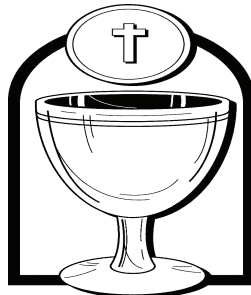

REPENT

"You are the man." These words, spoken to King David by the prophet Nathan in the passage just before today's first reading, were a wake-up call to David that he had done wrong in taking the wife of Uriah and having Uriah killed in battle. The story that woke David up to his own guilt was about a rich man who had many sheep, but took and slaughtered the only sheep of a poor man. David thought the man should be punished, but when Nathan made known to him that this story was about David himself, David woke up to his own sin and repented, and the Lord forgave him.

Today's psalm of David reinforces for us the necessity of recognizing our own guilt and confessing it before the Lord. Then "[Blessed is the one whose fault is taken away, / whose sin is covered]" (Psalm 32:1). God becomes our shelter, and gives us back our freedom.

SAINT ROMUALD (c. 951-1027)

June 19

"God so loved the world," declares John 3:16. "Do not love the world," warns 1 John 2:15. The "world" to love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God's children all. The "world" to flee: "sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life" (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald's conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his privileged world, Romuald sought God's world in monastic life. Its winding turns and several dead ends make Romuald's journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit's solitary struggle and community life's unique challenges shaped Romuald's legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California--in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe--integrate Romuald's experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still. -- Peter Scagnelli

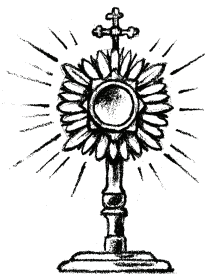
From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

Word is getting out that your pastor (me) is going to be in a musical this summer at the Heyde Center for the Arts. That rumor is actually true! The musical is called "The Boyfriend," a spoof of the English musical comedies of the 1920's. Why, you might ask, is your pastor in a musical called "The Boyfriend?" There is a little bit of history to this. Back when I was a senior in high school, Nancy Scobie taught speech and drama at McDonell and Jerry Way was the band director. "The Boyfriend" was the musical for that year, and I played the part of "Bobby." The musical involved a lot of singing and 1920's dancing. My mother, a former professional dancer and dance teacher, ended up being the choreographer for the show. During rehearsals she was diagnosed with cancer, and in fact had a major surgery just prior to the performance. She was able to make it to the performances and come up on stage to receive her roses. I was so proud of her. She died the following September. Nancy Scobie and Jerry Way reunite to direct "The Boyfriend" again some 37 years later. Nancy asked me to take a part. I, of course, will not be playing "Bobby," but "Percival" or "Percy," a widower who visits his daughter Polly at her finishing school. "Polly" is played by Maria Wild, and her beau in the show is "Tony," played by Jake Christopher -- two very talented young people, one from each of my parishes. So, if you have nothing to do on the weekend of July 23, 24, and 25 you might want to take in a performance.

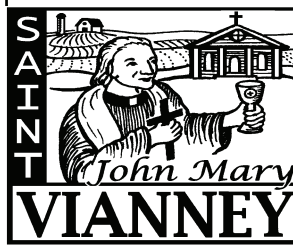
