FOLLOW FAITHFULLY

When Elijah calls Elisha to follow him, Elisha goes back, momentarily, to finish some business at home. But note that he does not leave the work to be done by those at home, nor does he plan to come back and finish it himself. He recognizes in Elijah's call that he must follow faithfully and not look back.

Psalm 16 celebrates the loving protection of God for those who depend on God's love and mercy. God is our portion and cup, in a line seen by Christians as a poetic reference to Eucharist, and God will not abandon us to death and corruption, but will call us into the holy Presence forever. This could be seen as resurrection, something that was not universally believed in the days before Jesus. BLESSED JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784)

July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan *padre* who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Blessed Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development. —Peter Scagnelli,

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

This is last Sunday before the close of our fiscal year on Wednesday, June 30. As I mentioned last week, we are so very close to closing the year *in the black* for the second year in a row, regarding our operational budget. What a blessing this is since the past two years have been some of the most difficult years in a long time. How grateful I am for you, and the generosity, sacrifice, and trust you have shown in support of our parish and schools. If you have fallen behind in your church support, or have gifts you want applied to this fiscal year, they need to be in to our central office by Wednesday; otherwise, they will be applied to next fiscal year. The same is true for your contributions to the Diocesan Annual Appeal. You can make your final payment through our office, and our finance officer will take care of that for you. We are still in the midst of the "We Belong to Christ" capital campaign. Contribution reminders are sent to you through the diocese. If there is any change in your original pledge, it is important that you simply let us know. Some people have had to cut back because of financial difficulties. Others have moved from the area; and of course, some people have passed away before their pledge could be fulfilled. We need to know if a pledge will be transferred to another parish if one has moved, or if the heirs of someone who died plan on fulfilling the pledge of the deceased. We receive frequent contact from the diocese regarding these questions. Simply contact our office with this information.
